Training Officer Ms. Aisha Shameen led an insightful activity highlighting the often-overlooked labour women perform daily. Participants placed pictures around a woman's portrait, representing the numerous tasks they handle household chores, caregiving, and other responsibilities that frequently go unnoticed. Through this visual exercise, the women gained a new perspective on their relentless efforts and understood their indispensable role in maintaining their families. This realization fostered a sense of pride and acknowledgment of their selfless dedication.

LAUGHTER, JOY, AND CHILDHOOD REVISITED

Adding an element of fun, a game of musical chairs brought waves of laughter and excitement. The women enthusiastically participated, expressing how much they enjoyed the moment. Many shared that it had been years since they last played such a game, and the experience brought back cherished childhood memories. The activity allowed them to embrace joy and reconnect with their playful side, free from daily burdens.

To ensure the mothers could fully engage in the festivities, a special children's corner was set up. While their little ones busied themselves with drawing and colouring, the women were able to relax, enjoy, and immerse themselves in the celebration without worry.

A HEARTFELT TRIBUTE AND UNFORGETTABLE MOMENTS

As the event drew to a close, RCI honoured the women and Power Girls with gifts and certificates, symbolizing their value and contribution to society. The recognition was deeply moving, as many women expressed that they had never felt so respected and appreciated before.

A particularly touching moment came from a 65-year-old woman who shared, **"In 65 years, this is the first time I have received so much respect."** When asked about their favourite part of the celebration, many women mentioned the musical chairs game and the respect they felt throughout the event. Some admitted they were initially hesitant to attend, but by the end of the day, they were grateful for the experience and overwhelmed with happiness.

One participant shared, **"We feel truly happy today. We had become so accustomed to household work every day that we forgot what joy felt like."**
